| Eligibility criteria <br> Applicants must be eligible to work in the UK, pay an application fee and meet the following criteria: <br> Where the criteria are met and the applicant has no unspent convictions for relevant or foreign offences, the personal licence must be granted. <br> Tutor notes <br> Explain that: <br> - the licensing authority must grant a personal licence if all criteria are met and no unspent convictions for relevant or foreign offences are identified <br> - an applicant with a relevant or foreign conviction may apply for a personal licence, however the chief officer of police may object if they believe the crime and disorder objective may be undermined <br> - any individual may apply for a personal licence whether or not they are employed or have any interests in a licensed business | A personal licence must be granted by the licensing authority if it appears the applicant is: <br> - is at least 18 years of age <br> - is entitled to work in the UK <br> - holds a licensing qualification <br> - has not had a previous licence forfeited within the last 5 years <br> - has no convictions for relevant offences, foreign offences or been required to pay an immigration penalty <br> The application will be rejected if the first 4 criteria are not met. <br> If convictions for relevant/foreign offences or immigration penalties are <br> identified, chief officer of police and or the Home Office must be notified. <br> Tutor notes <br> - Licensing authority must grant a personal licence if all 5 criteria are met. <br> - If relevant/foreign convictions and/or payment of an immigration penalty are identified the licensing authority must send a notice to the chief officer of police for the area. <br> - The chief officer of police may object if they believe the crime and disorder objective may be undermined. <br> - Any individual may apply for a personal licence whether or not they are employed or have any interests in a licensed business | Slide 31 to slide 30 were swapped around so that application procedure is before determination of application. <br> The tutor notes on the new slide 36 have been updated. |
