




31	<p>The slide has been updated: Local schemes, involving licence holders, retailers, police and others has been updated to:</p> <p>In some areas, an Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy may be in place.</p>  <p>The removal of LAA's from the tutor notes</p> <p>Tutor notes Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs) are local initiatives producing policies to reduce crime and disorder, usually involving the police, local authorities and other organisations.</p> <p>CSP's have to publish a strategy every 3 years showing how they will tackle crime and disorder in their area.</p> <p>Discuss with candidates the role of pub watch, shop watch and other radio link groups operating in local areas.</p> <p>Trainers may wish to mention:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• community alcohol partnerships which help tackle underage drinking in local areas through co-operation with retailers and licence holders• in some areas, an Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy may be in place

77	<p>This slide has been updated to:</p>  <p>The slide content is as follows:</p> <p>Offences</p> <p>It is an offence to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sell or allow the sale of alcohol to an under 18 • allow the consumption of alcohol by an under 18 • deliver or allow the delivery of alcohol to an under 18 • send an under 18 to collect alcohol • allow an under 18 to sell alcohol • purchase or attempt to purchase alcohol for an under 18 <p>Some exceptions apply.</p> <p>< ⏪ ⏩ > 77</p>
80	<p>Tutor notes – the following text has been added:</p> <p>The consumption of alcohol by a young person under these circumstances is at the discretion of a responsible person on the premises and may be refused or limited.</p>
88	<p>The ID information on this slide has been updated to:</p>  <p>The slide content is as follows:</p> <p>Acceptable ID</p> <p>The following are most often acceptable. However, this may differ depending upon the policy of the premises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a valid passport • a UK or European Union photo card driving licence • a photographic identity card bearing the Proof-of-Age Standard Scheme (PASS) hologram • military ID <p>All forms of acceptable ID must include the holder's photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark or ultraviolet feature.</p> <p>< ⏪ ⏩ > 88</p>

Problems caused by premises	Closure notice up to 48 hours	Application for closure order	Closure order for up to 3 months	Action following a closure order
<p>➔</p> <p>Nuisance - either has occurred or is likely to occur.</p> <p>Disorder - either has occurred or is likely to occur.</p>	<p>➔</p> <p>Closure notice by police inspector or local council for up to 24 hours.</p> <p>Closure notice by police superintendent or council Chief Executive up to 48 hours.</p> <p>Cannot prevent access to premises by those living on a premises.</p>	<p>➔</p> <p>Application to magistrates.</p> <p>To be considered within 48 hours of closure notice issue (unless cancelled).</p> <p>Temporary orders - to extend closure notice for further 48 hours or for up to 14 days where hearing adjourned.</p>	<p>➔</p> <p>Serious nuisance to the public or disorder likely to occur through use of premises.</p> <p>Disorderly, offensive or criminal behaviour on the premises.</p>	<p>Review of the premises licence by the licensing authority within 28 days of closure order.</p> <p>Extended closure for further 3 months (up to a maximum 6 months).</p>



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
