

37	<p>The statistics have been updated:</p> <div data-bbox="284 645 1008 1182"><h3>Accident statistics – all industries</h3><p><b>Fatal injuries 2020/2021: 142</b></p><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>The main cause is falls from a height</li></ul><p><b>Non-fatal injuries 2019/2020: 525,000</b></p><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Slip, trips or falls on same level 29%</li><li>Handling, lifting or carrying 19%</li><li>Struck by moving object 11%</li><li>Acts of violence 9%</li><li>Falling from a height 8%</li></ul><p><b>Over-7-day absence injuries in 2019/2020: 168,000.</b></p></div>
224	<p>The tutor notes have been updated:</p> <div data-bbox="284 1317 1008 1863"><h3>Stress</h3><p><b>Stress:</b> the adverse reaction people have to excessive pressure </p><p>It is not a disease</p><p>It can lead to mental or physical ill health.</p></div>

**Stress, depression and anxiety led to an estimated 17.9 million working days lost in 2019/2020** - tutor is to gain updated stats from HSE site and discuss with Class. The HSE define stress as an adverse reaction people have to excessive pressures or other types of demand placed on them. Work-related stress is not an illness but can lead to increased health problems.
